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#### SHORT SYNOPSIS

A psychological romantic drama which deals with one man's struggle with his conscience as he realises that he has become his own worst hate: the 'other' man. He must now decide which is stronger: the hate that he feels for himself, or the love that he feels for his partner.

#### LONG SYNOPSIS

'Andrew' is a psychological romantic drama which deals with one man's struggle with his conscience as he realises that he has become his own worst hate: the 'other' man. The film centres on a couple, Andrew and Sue, who have fallen in love with each other, despite the fact that Sue is married to another man. However, Andrew is racked with guilt at the thought of inflicting on Sue's husband, the pain that was caused to him when his ex-wife left him for another man. As Andrew's conscience catches up with him it becomes clear that he must decide which is stronger: the increasing hate that he feels for himself, or the love that he feels for Sue.



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### DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

The idea for *Andrew* can be traced back to the summer of 2006, when I wrote the following note in my journal:

*Had an idea for a new short film:*

*A man falls in love with a woman, but the woman is married. Due to the fact that the man lost his first wife because she had an affair with another man, he passionately hates the idea of having an affair and of being the 'other man'. The film – to be told largely through visuals – would deal with how he comes to terms with this: does he become something that he hates in order to gain something that he loves, or does he sacrifice something that he loves in order to avoid becoming what he hates?*

For a number of reasons, it was a while before the first draft of this script was written. By the time I came to write the first draft, the idea had developed, and the script came to focus not on someone who is *falling* in love with a married woman, but on someone who is *already* in love with a married woman. Thus, he has, in many ways, already become what it is that he hates. However, despite this minor shift in emphasis, the central dilemmas of the film are already clearly apparent in this initial outline (these being the idea of self-loathing and the complex relationship between love and hate). The film's philosophical exploration of the emotions of love and (self-) hate are wrapped up in the idea of infidelity, but of course infidelity should only be seen as one example of these emotions coming into play. Thus, the idea of being the 'other man' is here being used as both a metaphor and a microcosm of the more general feeling of simply not liking the person that you have become, or, at the least, disliking some of your actions – something I'm sure everyone can relate to in one way or another as, quite simply, we all make mistakes. Of course, such feelings and thoughts bring to light feelings of guilt, and it is ultimately Andrew's heavy conscience that leads to the internal struggle that is really at the heart of the film. I hope, therefore, that the emotional core of *Andrew* will raise many questions on a number of themes ranging from conscience (is it *ever* really wrong to fall in love?) to infidelity (is it *ever* really right to cheat?) to the interplay and relationship between the twin emotions of love and hate (which is ultimately the stronger of these two emotions, and can they ever truly be separated?).

#### Alex Barrett – Writer/Director



Even from a young age Alex exhibited a keen interest in the visual arts, and it wasn't long before he found his true passion in life: the cinema.

In 2005 Alex received a BA (Hons) in Film and Video from Surrey Institute of Art & Design, where he developed a style of striking visuals and probing psychological inquiry, before exploring the film-making medium itself in his graduation film 'Is This A Question? Is This An Answer?', which enjoyed several successful festival screenings. During his final year, Alex also edited the festival-screened short film 'Tuesday'.

In Autumn 2005 he co-founded the production company Tiga Kali Studio, and has since gone on to write and direct a number of projects, both personal and commissioned, with the company. In addition, he has also achieved success with his freelance work, such as the WWII-drama 'Between the Lines' (FXHome.com's top rated film of all time). His latest short prior to 'Andrew'- 'Great & Small' – can currently be seen playing at film festivals around Europe. #### Angus Watts – Producer



Angus has been working in the film & TV industry since completing a course at the NYFA at the beginning of 2006. He is both passionate and fascinated by film, and in particular film production. Angus set up the production company 'Roll With It Productions' in March 2007 in order to be able to express his creative and practical ideas in making independent films. Andrew is the first short to be produced

by the company, although Angus has produced two other short films, and wrote, directed and produced a further short.

In order to gain further experience and contacts in the industry, Angus has been working as an Assistant Director and Runner for the past 15 months. He has worked on a wide range of productions, such as the films 'Miss Potter' and 'Telstar', to TV programmes 'Waking the Dead' (BBC), 'Hustle' (BBC) and the upcoming 'He Kills Coppers' (ITV). This has enabled him to gain a valuable insight to the financial, technical and logistical workings of the filmmaking process.

All this followed a MA in Ancient History from Edinburgh University, which in part he was able to combine with film studies. In the future Angus hopes to produce further short films, as well as furthering his career as an Assistant Director, with the ultimate goal of producing feature films.

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#### **Polly Morgan – Cinematographer**

Polly grew up fascinated by film, relishing the escapism and opportunity to delve into new worlds beyond her own. After studying Art and History of Art, Polly gained a 1<sup>st</sup> in BA (*hons*) in Broadcasting at Leeds University. At 21 she discovered the world of Cinematography, spending a year in Canada, working on film sets and in a Camera Rental House, and then 12 months back in London at Ridley Scott's Production Company. In the four years that followed, Polly found inspiration and education working as a freelance Clapper Loader on international feature films and commercials. Over the last 12 months Polly has left the world of assisting behind and has concentrated on developing her Reel as a Director of Photography. As well as photographing 'Andrew' she has shot a further three short films and a handful of music videos. Inspired by Artists she has studied and Cinematographers she admires, Polly is keen to make her mark on film, creating a world full of emotion, mood and feeling for the audience to escape in.



#### **Murat Kebir – Editor**

After graduating with a degree in Electronic studies, Murat went on to work for TRT Turkish Television, where he worked as an editor on wide range of projects, including documentaries, light entertainment and drama. After moving to England 16 years ago, Murat worked as an assistant editor at some of London's most reputable post-production houses. His work there included major projects for the BBC, Channel Four, ITV, Cartoon Network, Discovery and Sky TV. He has been a Senior Editor at Sky Television for the past 10 years, where his projects include movies, promos and sport programmes. Murat has also served as an editor on 8 short films during the last 4 years, working with a variety of formats, and which have been to festivals worldwide.



#### **Jason Creasey – Sound recordist**

With a successful 20-year career of composing & sound design for clients ranging from Erasure to The Royal Opera House, Jason changed to adapt his diverse studio-based knowledge & deep understanding of sound to fit into the world of location recording & mixing for film. "Location recording has given my ears the chance to negotiate the challenges of capturing clean audio, whilst the post production mixing & sound design has allowed my attention to detail to expand beyond the usual sonic footprint of musical instruments." It all enables a more intimate grasp of a script & its characters, which is particularly useful if composing for the film as well. 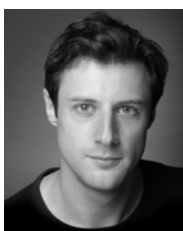
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#### **Jennifer - Angela Peters**

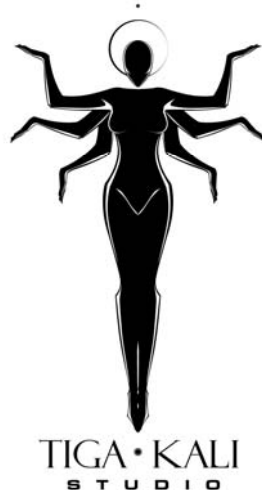
